

WSC COVID Monitor - Daily Checklist

(revised 4/12/2021)

The requirements in this document are defined by THPRD. If Westside soccer does not follow the rules, we jeopardize the health of our community and the success of our spring soccer season.

When performing the job of COVID monitor, you need to be actively performing that role for the entire practice or game. Please do not coach or spectate.

Before Going to Field:

- Make sure that you are healthy enough to be at the soccer activity. The health requirements that apply to players and coaches also apply to the COVID Monitor.
- Please arrive 20-30 minutes before the scheduled practice or game. As soon as the prior teams clear the area, then you are on duty as COVID monitor.

Before the Game/Practice Starts:

- Check in with the coaches and officials and identify yourself as a COVID Monitor. For games there should always be one COVID monitor for each team.
- Monitor the flow of foot traffic to the field. Ask spectators to follow the path shown on the THPRD map for that field.
- Make sure spectators are going to the spectator area.
- Check the bench area of all teams. Make sure soccer gear and seating are spaced at least 6 feet apart for all players, coaches and officials. Notify the coach if action is needed.
- Fill out the health check form for your team if requested by the head coach. Anyone who answers YES to any of the 5 questions may not participate.

While on Site:

- At the beginning of the game or practice, announce to all spectators that you are the COVID monitor and your job is to ensure the COVID rules are followed. Answer any questions.
- Highest Priority tasks:
 - Make sure that all COVID monitors, coaches, spectators and players off the field wear face coverings at all times. The referee will handle players on the field.
 - Ensure that spectators are maintaining social distance of at least 6 feet between households and staying in the spectator area, away from players and coaches.
- If any spectators are not following these rules, then:
 - Inform them of the expectation and nicely ask them to comply.
 - If a spectator refuses to comply with the rule, notify all coaches and ask for help.
 - If the spectator still refuses to comply (at games), notify the center referee to immediately stop the game. It must remain stopped until the spectator complies.
- Other tasks:
 - Remind players and spectators to use the correct portable restroom.
 - When a game or practice is nearing its conclusion, make sure that players and coaches for the next game or practice remain in the parking area until the field is totally clear.
- Be aware that practices and games are held at public locations and people not associated with the practice or game may be present. They may be walking, running, playing on a playground, etc. Such people are allowed to be there, however, you should make sure they maintain appropriate distance from the soccer activity.
- In the case of any injury that requires attention from the parent, the coach can allow that parent to enter the field area, maintaining at least 6 feet distance from everyone except the player.
